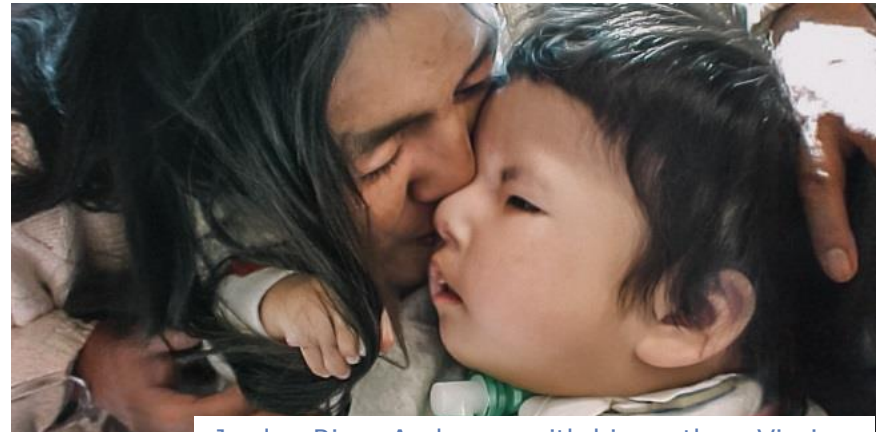

Background

January 26, 2016

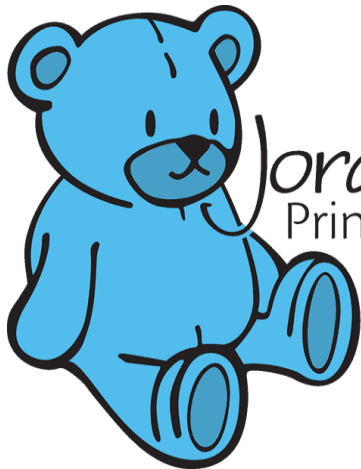
- CHRT Rules Canada's provision of First Nations Child and Family Services was discriminatory

November 16, 2021

- CHRT issued 2021 CHRT 41 containing orders to fund purchase and construction of capital assets for delivery of First Nations Child and Family Services and services under Jordan's Principle

January 18, 2022

- CHRT amended orders in decision of November 16, 2021 following a submission of a consent motion from Canada and the parties

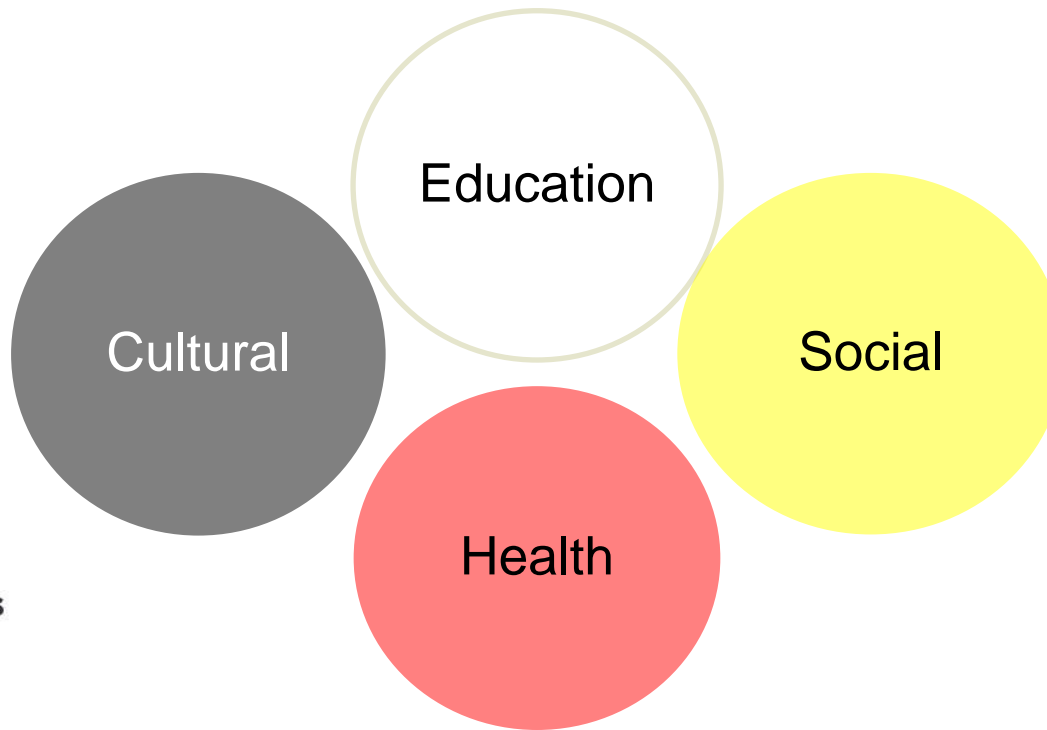
Funding approach for life-cycle



Who is eligible?

- First Nations
- First-Nations authorized service providers delivering Jordan's Principle services

What is eligible?



Capital Assets & Eligible Costs

Capital Assets:

- Property, buildings, or spaces intended for long-term use.

Eligible costs under CHRT41:

- Purchase, construction, or renovation of on-reserve assets that are ready to proceed.
- Off-reserve capital assets are not eligible under Jordan's Principle; however, pre-capital planning funding is available for off-reserve projects.
- For on-reserve projects, costs related to all project phases, including pre-capital planning, construction, design, and completion, are eligible.

Linkages of Assets to Jordan's Principle:

- Assets must provide safe, accessible confidential, culturally and age-appropriate spaces to support delivery of Jordan's Principle services.
- Existing or current Jordan's Principle Group or Individual funding must be directly linked to capital asset, including office space related to Jordan's Principle service coordination.

Construction Project Phases

1. Pre-Capital Planning

2. Design

3. Construction

4. Completion

1. Pre-Capital Planning

- Capital Needs Assessment
- Functional Program
- Functional Plan
- Technical Feasibility Study
- Geotechnical Investigation
- Site Survey
- Signed letter and/or Band Council Resolution

2. Design Phase

- The design plan specifies in detail the preferred solution for meeting the service need, including factors such as lot servicing, access to services, and supporting infrastructure (water, wastewater, internet, electricity, roads).
- Designs must meet applicable codes and must be approved and certified by a professional engineer or architect licensed to practice in the province/territory where the proposed work will be undertaken.
- The design plan is the final component needed to determine if a project is “ready to proceed”.
- A tendering process for construction follows confirmation that a project is ready to proceed.

Construction and Completion Phases

3. Construction Phase

- A contract is awarded to the construction company following completion of the tendering process.
- Indigenous Services Canada flows funding to the requestor and construction begins.

4. Completion Phase

- Once construction is complete, the professional firm issues a certificate of project completion.

Multi-Purpose Assets

Indigenous Services Canada takes a holistic approach in partnership with the First Nation, to ensure that needs are met, while working with other project partners including, but not limited to, First Nation Child and Family Services.

- Consideration of a multi-purpose asset must be addressed during pre-capital planning and design.
- Jordan's Principle will contribute proportionally.
- Partial funding decisions are possible.

Timelines and Key Dates

Within 2 business days

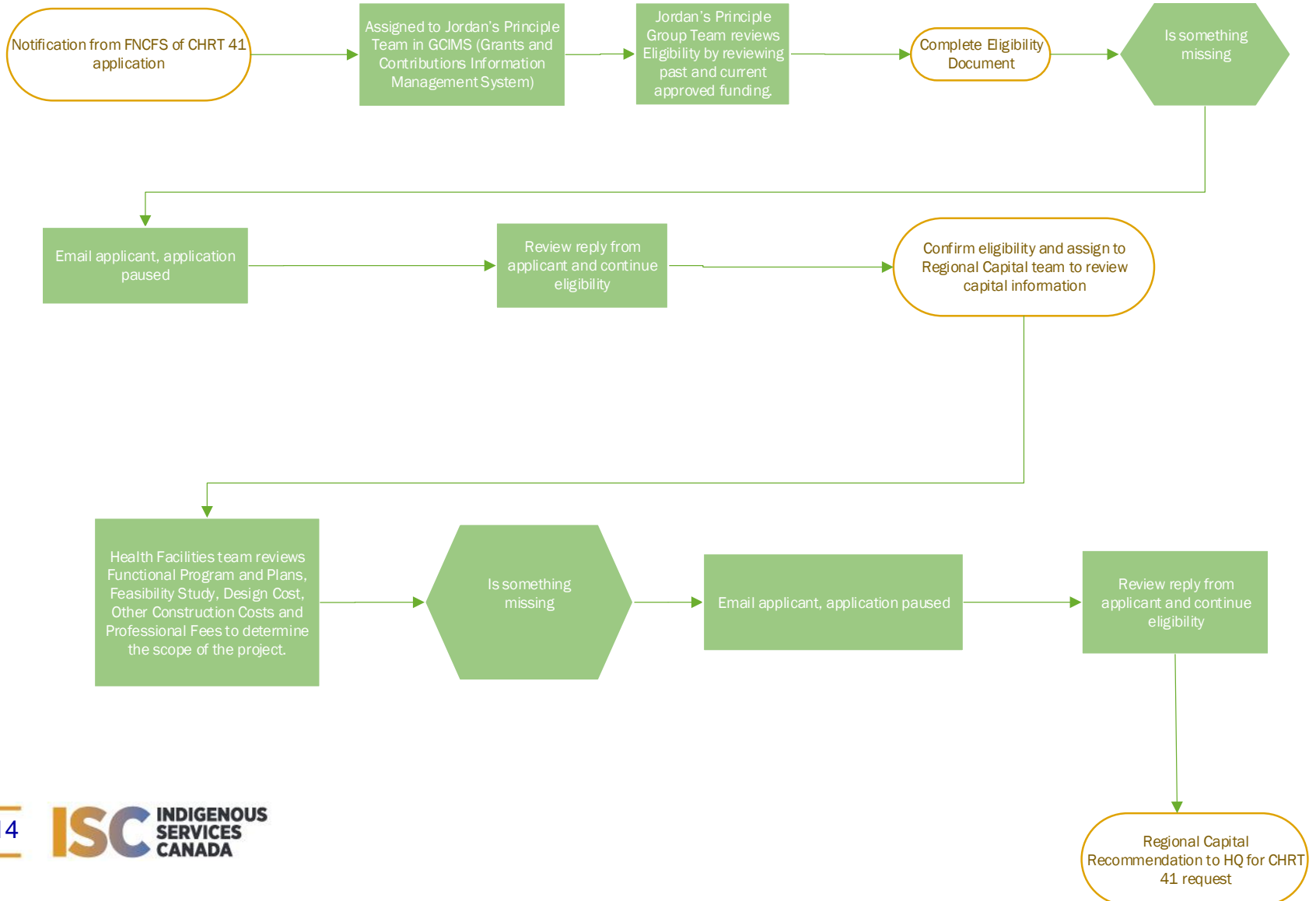
- Confirmation of receipt
- Clarify missing information (if any)

Within 30 business days

- Notify full funding decision

- Each new stage the 30 business day clock starts over
- When request is sent back for further information the 30 business day clock is placed on pause and restarts upon submission of package.

Funding Process



Who approves requests?

- All requests approved by Assistant Deputy Minister responsible for Capacity, Infrastructure and Accountability Division
- Requests potentially denied will be first reviewed by Senior Assistant Deputy Minister responsible for Jordan's Principle


Ineligible Request?

- Upon final decision the requestor will receive communication no later than 30 business days of receiving complete submission
- Communication will include detailed explanation for the decision and information on appeals process
- The Coordination Unit will try to identify other potential funding options.


