The Canada Ontario Resource Development Agreement (CORDA) Office is now accepting funding applications for 2019-2020.

Eligible project categories include:

- ✓ Forestry
- ✓ Trapping
- ✓ Fishing
- ✓ Other*

** Examples include rice harvesting, eco-tourism, land use planning, and maple syrup production.*

Projects may include training such as a youth trapper course, employment, stewardship, traditional learning, equipment (such as humane traps), and supplies (such as trees for planting).

The Canada Ontario Resource Development Agreement (CORDA) is an agreement between Canada, Ontario and First Nations' members in Ontario.

The Agreement promotes resource and economic development initiatives of First Nations' members by providing financial assistance to develop and utilize sustainable natural resources.

First Nations, their members and organizations, and Treaty organizations in Ontario are eligible to apply for funding.

The maximum funding level for projects is \$35,000 per year.

CORDA is funded by Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada and the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry.
