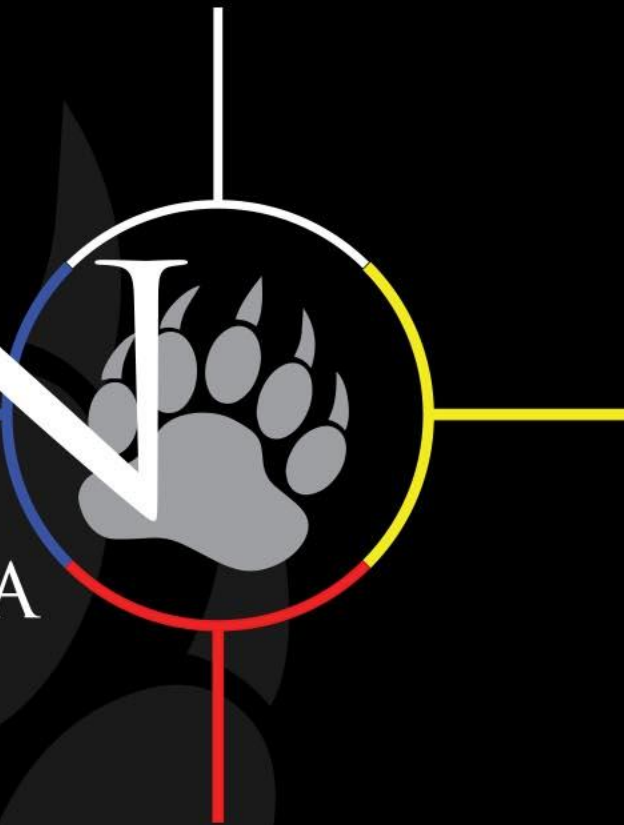

ISN Maskwa



- A majority Indigenous-owned corporation that began operations in Ontario in 2020, ISN Maskwa is owned by the Missanabie Cree First Nation and is operated in partnership with Investigative Solutions Network Inc.

About ISN Maskwa



- Canada's first Indigenous Emergency Operations Centre (IEOC) and a leader in training and deploying in Indigenous communities
- Building the initiative across the province of “Indigenous-led Community Support” in regards to evacuation and emergency response



Community Support Personnel Teams



- ISN Maskwa has successfully deployed teams of trained Community Support Personnel (CSP) into First Nations to assist communities during times of crisis
- Teams provide supporting roles in the communities through programming, community events, community safety and housing, and many other positive measures.
- 175 Indigenous community members have been trained on the Evacuation Support Specialist Security Training Course
- Approximately 65% have already been on deployment with Maskwa and others are finding exciting careers with such policing agencies as Treaty 3 Police, Nishnawbe-Aski Police Service, Anishinabek Police Service and the Ontario Provincial Police
- Gain the trust and respect from community leaders and members through their compassionate commitment to the work they have set out to complete

Incident Command Teams



- ISN Maskwa offers Indigenous individuals from across the province the opportunity to train in Incident Management Systems (IMS), levels 100 to 300
- The overall goal is to train, deploy and mentor Indigenous incident command teams in providing incident command during Indigenous evacuations. The training is premium, experiential hands-on learning that is based upon Indigenous emergencies
- ISN Maskwa has successfully completed one IMS/ICS training course up to level 400, that saw 21 graduates, many of which have gone on to obtain essential emergency management roles within their bands, their tribal councils, the Nishnawbe Aski Nation and deployments with ISN Maskwa.

Pic Mobert 2022



- Pic Mobert First Nation called a State of Emergency due to youth suicides in the community
- Deployment Dates:
 - February 2022 to Present
 - Approximately 25 CSPs have been deployed at one time or another during this deployment plus supervisors

Many positive experiences have been encountered while our team has been deployed in Pic Mobert FN. There have been incidents however, that tested the knowledge and skills of our team members:

- CPR Request
- Youth Arrest
- Suicides
- Drowning Rescue
- Calls not to get involved in – Fight, Domestic

Nursing Stations 2022



- August 23rd, 2022, ISN Maskwa contacted by Indigenous Services Canada and requested to assist First Nations and Inuit Health Branch in assessing the security operations of remote nursing stations in Northern Ontario
- The ongoing nursing shortage in Ontario was believed to have caused tensions between community members and medical staff working in remote communities
- Deployed Supervisors and Community Support Personnel to 5 remote communities within 48 hrs
- The assessments and additional security support were completed by September 11th
