4-PERSON SCRAMBLE RULES SHEET



Each group competes as a team for the LOWEST TEAM GROSS SCORE for the 18 holes.

GOLF ETIQUETTE

1. Avoid slow play. If the team behind you is catching up quickly, please allow them to go ahead of you at the next hole to minimize the chance of a lineup of teams behind you.
2. After you have made your shot, please smooth all marks.
 - a. Replace your divots the best you can without causing additional damage.
 - b. In sand bunkers, please use the rake after you have made your shot to smooth shot marks and footprints.
3. Balls may be cleaned on the green, and ball marks repaired prior to putting. You may not repair spike marks prior to putting.
4. Leave the putting green as soon as you have holed out.
5. Do not play until the players in front of you are out of range.
6. While COVID-19 restrictions have lifted, we continue to promote the use of hand sanitizer and encourage everyone to remain kind, understanding, and respectful of others choice to mask or unmask.
7. Enjoy the day!

SCRAMBLE RULES

1. **Men tee off from the blue tees.**
2. **Women and youth (ages 6-16 years) tee off from the red tees.**
3. ***Optional: seniors 50+ years of age may tee off from the white tees.***
4. A **scramble** means that all team members tee off on each hole. The team collectively decides which tee shot is most desirable and marks the spot with a tee or ball marker.
5. Other team members pick up their balls and play their next shot within one club length (no closer to the hole) of the marked spot.
6. If the ball you choose to play is in a hazard (sand, water, etc.), the rough, or out of bounds, you cannot drop the ball outside of the hazard or rough even if relief is within one club length away.
7. Follow this procedure for the remainder of the holes, including putts. The ball should be marked on the putting green also.
8. Putts need to be made within 3 inches of the marked spot (no closer to the hole). The first ball to go in the hole is counted for the team score. The team is cautioned not to make "tap" in putts until all team members have had the opportunity to attempt the team's original putt.
9. Should you have to play as a threesome, one member of the threesome may hit or putt an extra time, on a rotational basis, to compensate for the fourth person.
 - a. The rotation should be set at the beginning of the round and remain constant throughout.
 - b. For example:
 - i. Hole 1 shot 1: ABCA
 - ii. Hole 1 shot 2: BCAB
 - iii. Hole 1 shot 3: CABC
 - iv. Hole 1 shot 4: ABCA
 - v. Hole 2 shot 1: BCAB

MULLIGANS

All golfers will receive 1 complimentary mulligan ticket with registration. However, additional mulligans can be purchased at registration/check-in for \$5.00 each.

1. To use a mulligan, ensure all team members are aware, and hand your mulligan ticket to your team's designated scorekeeper.
2. Mulligans can be used for a redo on any stroke, except for the Hole-in-One contest holes.

CONTESTS

Categories for contests will be Men and Women, the two categories include youth golfers. There will be a sign at each contest hole.

Closest to the Pin: \$2.00 entry fee for all golfers. Please sign up at the registration table.

NOTE: The men's contest will be played on Middle #8, and the women's contest will be played on East #4.

Longest Drive: \$2.00 entry fee for all golfers. Please sign up at the registration table.

NOTE: This men's contest will be played on East #9, and the women's contest will be played on Middle #6.

Hole-In-One: All golfers get a chance at the Hole-In-One contest holes, and everyone must tee off from the same tee (men, women, and junior youth).

1. Tournament officials will be stationed at the indicated hole during the tournament until all golfers have participated.
2. In the case of a Hole-in-One, certification of achievement must be made on the scorecard of the participant receiving the Hole-in-One by the tournament official monitoring play at the selected hole, and all participants on the team the Hole-in-One was made.
3. A ball hit out of bounds and replayed does not qualify as a Hole-in-One – this would constitute a Hole-in-Three.
4. Mulligans cannot be used on the Hole-in-One contest hole.
5. There is only one Hole-in-One winner, this will be the first person to achieve this on the designated hole.

NOTE: There are **TWO** Hole-In-One contest holes.

East #2 – Prize of \$10,000, sponsored by St. Clair College Alumni Association.
