


Community Capacity Support:

Reviewed national guidelines and implemented regional policies and processes to align ourselves internally to better support partners.

Secured \$1,178,496 to support Community Health and Wellness Planning for 2023/2024.

Forecasting an additional need of \$8,448,499 in one time planning costs for community health plans.



Health Systems Integration Funding 23/24 activities:

Supporting planning for broader Health Transformation

- Engagement development strategies and support engagement for leadership and communities; draft health models, governance laws in preparation for tri-partite negotiations
- Preparation for transfer of FNIHB direct service delivery; this has included Environmental Public Health, increasing focus on primary care nursing transfer and Health Human Resource strategies
- External/internal, federal-provincial policy, legislation review; gaps analysis



Regional focus to support Health Transformation:


Community Capacity Support

Facilitate planning processes between recipients and health specialists within FNIHB for the development of an accountability document that guides all aspects of health services and program delivery, which will provide First Nations and Inuit communities with sustainable funding as well as increased flexibility. Including working with recipients to resource priorities that are identified through formal community development planning processes for needs-based funding.

Health Transformation

Supports closer integration of federally funding and provincial/territorial health services targeting First Nations and Inuit communities; incrementally moving towards greater local authority, management of health service delivery and design to improve access to health services while increasing efficiencies.





What are our next steps:

Develop and implement a regional Health Transfer and Transformation workplan for FNIHB Ontario Region, including activities for internal collaboration and external transfer of services.

Continued internal realignment to support partners increase local capacity and responsibility for health delivery and governance.
