Our Funding Programs

- Lands and Economic Development Services
 Program (LEDSP) Core and Targeted
- Community Opportunity Readiness Program (CORP) – Major and Minor

Lands and Economic Development Services Program (LEDSP) - Core

- Core funding for economic development formula-based funding allocated
- Potential Core Funding Opportunities for lands management funding through the portion of LEDSP previously known as Reserve Lands and Environment Management Program (RLEMP) or through the First Nations Lands Management Initiative (FNLM)

Lands and Economic Development Services Program (LEDSP) - Targeted

- Proposal-based funding stream
- Supports capacity development projects that prepare communities for economic development and lands opportunities
- Rolling applications (continuous intake)

LEDSP Targeted – Eligible Activities

Initiatives that support...

- First Nations and Inuit communities to undertake economic development activities including, capacity development, and land, environment and/or economic development planning.
- Development of land and resources that are on community land or not under community control such as additions to reserves [ATRs] that support economic development

LEDSP Targeted – Eligible Activities

Initiatives that support...

- Compliance with the statutory provisions of the Indian Act, undertaking the land designation process and the processing of land administrative instruments such as leases and permits;
- Enhanced environmental awareness and support efforts towards pollution prevention on reserve;
- Environmental management best practices with land and community assets on reserve; and

Community Opportunity Readiness Program (CORP)

- Project-based funding
- Two funding streams:
- 1. Acquisition or Expansion of a community-owned business where there is an equity gap (single business)
 - 2, Economic Infrastructure (multiple businesses)
